We are continuing to offer an Instrumental Music Program for our secondary school students in 2022. Lessons are offered for the following instruments: Brass, woodwind, percussion, keyboard, guitar and music theory. The lessons are given once a week and the timetable will be arranged so that the student does not miss the same school subject each week. The school is providing the lessons as part of the teaching and learning program so there is no extra charge for the music lessons.

Students can hire brass and woodwind instruments from the school if they do not have their own instrument.

### **AFL Clinic**



This week we were lucky enough to have a visit from a group of AFL development coaches. These coaches are running two sessions over two weeks with each of the primary classes, to give them a taste of what Auskick and AFL is all about. The students had a great time this week participating in the skill/game session.



Face masks are required for students in Year 3 to Year 12 and Inclusive Education unless an exemption applies. Exemptions include students with a physical or mental disability where their disability means it would not be suitable. Parent/carers of a student/s who meet the criteria for an exemption must provide their approval in writing to the school nurse, for their child/ren to not wear a mask to the school.

Our school will follow the directions of the Victorian Chief Health Officer and aims to provide the safest environment possible for students and staff. I strongly encourage you to discuss wearing masks with your children to reduce COVID-19 transmission risk for their health and for other childrens' health as well. When we all work together as a community, we will have the best chance to keep children healthy and reduce the risk of them catching and spreading COVID-19, as well as keeping their teachers safe too.

For children who are able to wear a mask, they can and should wear a mask. For those children who cannot on some days or all days, that is okay. Almost all children will be able to and we will help them learn and support them to use masks well, when indoors, throughout the school day.

### Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students and \$225 for eligible secondary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you would like to apply, please contact the school office on 5771 1300 and ask for an application form.

You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page.

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

RE: Grant Street, Seymour – Proposed Parking Restrictions Notification

Mitchell Shire Council has received representation requesting a review of the existing parking restrictions on Grant Street, Seymour, during the morning school peak period.

Mitchell Shire Council investigated the parking during the morning peak on Grant Street, between Tehan Street and Stewart Street and found that when vehicles were parked either side, the school bus cannot go through.

As a result, Council will be installing "No Stopping, 8am-9.30am, 2.30pm-4.00pm", school days', parking restrictions to avoid vehicles parking on the north west side of Grant Street. Please refer to the attached plan. This will improve safety and traffic flow during the pick up and drop off times.

Council also received representation from Seymour College requesting parking restrictions on the north west side of Grant Street, between Stewart Street and the school gate, due to the trucks manoeuvring difficulties when two vehicles were parking on both sides.

Council decided to restrict that section to improve traffic safety and manoeuvring of trucks on Grant Street, between Stewart Street and the school gate.


