We have completed our Anzac Commemorative Services this week and my thanks to all involved with organising and presenting to our students.

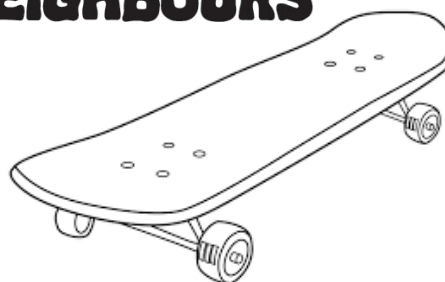
Gnarly Neighbours has also been a great success, with students engaging in new skills.

Dear parents and carers,

The department and our school are strongly encouraging all staff and students to take part in the rapid antigen testing program. Tests should be conducted twice a week, on school days, at home, for the first 4 weeks of Term 2. For specialist schools, tests should be conducted five days a week (on each school day), for the first 4 weeks of Term 2.

Rapid antigen testing is helping students and staff return safely to school and ensures positive cases are identified as quickly as possible. The more staff and students we have performing the tests, the more protected our community and our school will be. Tests can be collected daily from the General Office between 8.30 am – 4.00 pm.

The rapid antigen testing program along with other COVID safe practices, is giving us confidence that we are doing everything we can to ensure students and staff are safe, and that our school will remain open.

I strongly encourage you to discuss rapid antigen testing with your children to help them understand how they can reduce COVID-19 transmission risk for their health, and for the health of others. When we all work together as a community, we will have the best chance to keep children healthy and reduce the risk of them catching and spreading COVID-19.
