Dear parents and carers

We are writing to you as parents/carers of a child or children in government, Catholic and independent schools across Victoria.

The Victorian Department of Health strongly recommends that face masks are worn in indoor settings.

As a result, we are asking all students aged 8 and over and all staff in all schools across Victoria to wear masks when in class (except where removing a mask is necessary for clear communication) from now to the end of winter.

Students won't be required or expected to wear masks when outdoors, and this expectation won't stop student participation in the full range of school activities, including music, sport and performances.

We are asking for your support in explaining to your child or children the importance of this simple step that will help keep our schools as safe as possible.

We also ask that you make sure your child (or children) takes a mask to school (and wears it if they are travelling on public transport) or collects a mask when they arrive at school.

We all appreciate how important it is for students to be back at school. This action will help make sure as many students and staff as possible are protected from COVID and other winter illness.

Thank for your help with this collective effort to keep our communities safe and healthy.

### Changes to VET at Seymour College in 2023: Attention Year 9, 10 and 11 Students

For the past few years, all Seymour College Year 10 students were involved in a VET course on Wednesdays. In 2023, there will be some changes to this arrangement. Year 10 students will have the opportunity to apply for a 2023 VET course, but may not be required to do a VET course such as Sport and Recreation at school if they are unsuccessful with their application. Students currently in Year 9 who want to do a VET course in Year 10 need to consider their VET course options now and apply in the next few weeks. Students in Years 10 or 11 who are planning on doing a VET course next year also need to be ready to complete their applications. The process will involve an online link where they enter their details and the course they want to apply for. The next step will involve completing the application process for the VET provider. More information about how to apply for VET courses will be available at the Information night on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> August. The list of courses students may consider is below (there are some VET courses not on the list that are inaccessible from Seymour). Students may need to travel to Docklands, Southbank, Broadmeadows or Shepparton, depending on the course. Some GOTAFE courses are available at the Wallis Street Campus in Seymour and the Trade Training Centre in Loco Street.



### Rapid antigen testing

The Victorian Government has provided our school community with a further delivery of rapid antigen tests for Term 3, please collect these from the General Office.

- It is recommended that rapid antigen tests are used by students and staff when symptomatic.
- Household contacts are required to test negative using a rapid antigen test on at least 5 out of 7 days if they are attending or working at our school.
- Please report any positive test result through the Department of Health system (<u>Rapid antigen tests</u> | <u>Coronavirus Victoria</u>) or via the coronavirus hotline at 1800 675 398 and quarantine for 7 days.

### **Face masks**

The Victorian Department of Health strongly recommends that face masks are worn in indoor settings, by all staff and students aged 8 years + from now to the end of winter (except if exempt).

Seymour College has a large range of mask options. We have a stock of N95 masks and surgical masks suitable for adults and older children and child-size surgical masks for students in primary schools. Students have access to these masks via the General Office or their classroom teacher.

We are still required to wear masks if we:

- 1. Are a household contact, over 8 years old and attending school. You're required to wear a face mask indoors unless you have a valid exception.
- 2. Everyone aged 8 years and above must wear a face mask when travelling on the school bus.
