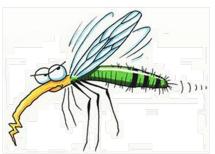

# From the Health Centre

#### Floods and mosquito-borne disease prevention



#### Staying safe from mosquitoes

After floods and heavy rainfall, mosquitoes can grow and spread in the pools of water left behind.

While the overall risk is low, some mosquitoes carry diseases that are spread through mosquito bites. Mosquitoes are more active at dusk and dawn, but some will also bite during the day.

The best way to prevent mosquito-borne diseases is to avoid mosquito bites.

Families can protect against mosquito bites by:

- covering up as much as possible with long, loose-fitting, light-coloured clothing
- applying insect repellent that contains picaridin or DEET on exposed skin before leaving home each morning
- limiting outdoor activity if lots of mosquitoes are active.

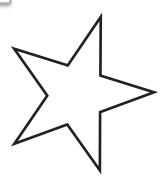

# Science News

#### **Seymour College Science Open Day.** (see poster attached)

Our year 7-9 science students are busy getting ready for the upcoming science open day on Friday December 9, 2022 in the Science Building. Students are investigating and working on their science projects and will be presenting their findings at the open day.

#### Year 10 students excel at Unboxy Challenge.

In early November Ms McClaren undertook professional development in Design Thinking and STEM at Bendigo Tech School. Whilst she was there Ms McClaren was introduced to Unboxy, the cardboard architecture, high impact, textural medium that inspires students and educators to experiment with shapes, forms and processes that can be integrated into schools. It is designed to complement, not disrupt, the environments where the activity takes place.

Unboxy is a kit of parts – large cardboard shapes and connectors allows the user to create the geometric forms of their choosing. A sense of collaboration and wellbeing is fostered as participants are encouraged to experiment, imagine, and push the basic shapes of Unboxy to its limits.



The Bendigo Tech School launched its Unboxy Challenge and Ms McClaren signed Seymour College up for the contest. Five of our brilliant year 10 students took up the challenge and spent the next few weeks building, testing and re-designing their Unboxy entry. The Competition had three possible elements to be addressed;

- Engineering (tallest structure)
- Visual Arts (most beautiful piece)
- Architectural Design (Shelter, scaled for students)

Our year 10 team attempted to address all three elements as they took on the challenge. Their finished piece was a structure at 2.66m high and they could stand underneath. They also attempted to make the piece visually appealing as well. Their submission was made on Friday 18th November and we have our fingers crossed that they will be successful in the challenge.

#### Seymour College successful in the Secondary Schools Agriculture Fund.

Seymour College Science Faculty were thrilled to hear the 'See more Agriculture at Seymour College' project grant application was successful and will see \$100,000 invested into the Agriculture Program. This project is supported by the Secondary Schools Agriculture Fund, which is funded by Agriculture Victoria as part of the four-year \$50 million Agricultural College Modernisation Program.

The Project 'See more Agriculture at Seymour College' is a revitalisation and innovation project aimed at introducing Agriculture as a career pathway for our students from Year 7-10. Seymour College has run agricultural science programs in the past and this project is about re-invigorating this curriculum-based approach with a regional mentoring and agricultural industry leading connections-based approach looking at supporting our local agricultural industries of beef, sheep (meat and wool), pork, poultry, and horticulture along with immersive studies in apiculture, aquaculture, horticulture and animal production using regenerative farming practices.

Victoria's gross value of agricultural production (GVAP) was \$17.8 billion in 2019–2020, an increase of 12 per cent from 2018–2019 and yet the ageing demographic of our farmers is increasing and there is a gap in people entering the agricultural workforce. So who will be growing our food and fibre in the Goulburn region in the future? It is our hope and intention that it will be Seymour College students meeting that need as a result of their participation in the agricultural science program enabling the development of the Delatite Road Campus through the 'See More Agriculture at Seymour College' project.

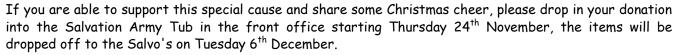
This year's portraits have been based on the POP Art artworks of Roy Lichtenstein and the students have loved applying their knowledge of colour and contrast to create them.
