**Dear Parents and Carers** 

Welcome to the last newsletter for 2022. My thanks to Ann Smith for her efforts in setting out and publishing the newsletter. It is an engaging publication that we look forward to reading each fortnight.

The valedictory dinner celebrated the achievements of our Year 12s and it was a memorable occasion for all. For some parents and carers, 2022 is the last year of having a child enrolled at Seymour College, and on behalf of the staff and college council I thank you for your partnership in the education of your child/ren.

We also welcomed our new 2023 Year 11s as they attended Head Start classes with our current students. This transition activity also allows teachers and students to begin the 2023 senior courses as well as students building strong relationships with their peers and coordinators.

2023 will see new initiatives for our college community. I am very excited to announce two important initiatives.

The first is the new wellbeing centre that is being prepared for the first day of Term 1 next year. The centre will offer a dedicated space for our wellbeing team to debrief and support students who need further support.


#### Dear families,



## Murrnong Farm Excursion

On Tuesday, F2A, F2B and Purple room students took a bus to Violet Town to visit Murrnong Farm. When we got there, we were greeted by the farm owner, David and his children Felix and Grace. After having a fruit snack and a run around after a long bus trip, we split up into 2 groups.

Felix and Grace took one group to learn about how the chickens eat all the fruit and the bugs that drop from the fruit trees to the ground and then their poo turns into compost that helps all the trees grow. We also learnt about fruit trees, and everyone got to pick and eat mulberries straight from the tree. There was juice everywhere!

The other group went with David to meet the goats. We took turns feeding the goats carob pods – their favourite snack. Then we went to see the bee boxes and learnt about how the bees get pollen from all the plants to make honey. We kept walking to see the dam and David told us about the big pump in the water and how it helps get water to all the plants and trees on the farm.

Everyone had a fantastic time, but we were all very tired on the bus ride back to school!
