#### ARMY WORK EXPERIENCE EXPO - PUCKAPUNYAL MILITARY AREA - 01 SEPTEMBER 2023

If you would like your child to attend, please approve on compass asap.

On behalf of the Australian Army's Combined Arms Training Centre and the Directorate of Youth (Defence Work Experience Program), we would like to extend the invitation for your students to attend the Army Career Expo on Friday 01 September 2023. The Australian Army will conduct a number of static displays and live demonstrations which students will be able to participate in. Students will be able to view equipment close up that is not normally open or accessible to the public. Some of the equipment on display will include:

- Australian Army School Armour: Display of Main Battle Tanks, Light Armoured Vehicles and Armoured Personnel Carriers.
- Australian Army School of Artillery: Display of M777 Guns, Air Defence Systems and Unmanned Aerial Systems.
- Australian Army School of Transport: Display all of Army's vehicle fleet including Heavy Vehicles and a number of Protected Mobility Vehicles including the Bushmaster and Hawkei.
- Australian Army School of Infantry: Display of an infantry section and all its capabilities.
- Defence Force School of Signals: Display of the communications systems used by the ADF on the modern battlefield.
- Students will be also able to participate in a number of hands on activities including a physical training lesson run by
- Physical Training Instructors from the Australian Army as well as the opportunity to ride in some of Army's vehicles.

### Year 10 Child Development elective



During Semester 1 in Year 10 Child Development students had the opportunity to explore all stages of a child's development from birth to four years old. We covered growth and development, prenatal development, reproductive systems, pregnancy, and the changes that occur to the mother, roles and responsibilities of being a parent, infant care and baby milestones.

Towards the end of the Semester Year 10's had to create a baby book to record our experience with the RealCare babies. We were given the option to take home a RealCare baby overnight or to look after them during a Child Development lesson. Students were required to identify their RealCare baby's coos and cries, so they knew which type of care they needed, for example burp, change a nappy, feed or rock. The RealCare baby's cries would go for longer and get louder if the right type of care was not administered. At the end of a RealCare Baby experience, a report was generated which outlines how the student performed as a carer and awards a percentage grade. Most students struggled with providing head

support for the baby's head and neck, this was an area where some students lost marks. Overall, most students found the experience useful and gave us a firsthand experience and insight into the pressures and responsibilities of being a new parent.



MAKE SAFETY YOUR STYLE

When choosing a bike helmet, make sure:

- It fits firmly and comfortably on your head and cannot be tilted in any direction.
- The straps can be adjusted so there is no slack when fastened.
- It has a sticker showing it is safety approved and meets the Australian/New Zealand Standard AS/NZS 2063
- It is marked with the symbol of a body accredited by the Joint Accreditation System of Australia and New Zealand (JAS-ANZ), certifying compliance with AS/NZS2063 (for helmets manufactured or imported from 1 July 2012).

A HELMET ON YOUR HANDLEBARS WON'T SAVE YOUR LIFE

A person riding a bike is 34 times more likely than vehicle occupants to be seriously injured in a crash. Wearing a bicycle helmet while riding reduces your risk of head injuries in a crash by up to 60%. However, if your helmet is on your handlebars, it won't protect your head.




