A Nationally Recognised Training Qualification

Auspiced or delivered by a TAFE



Why choose a VET course?

- The VET subject area is of genuine interest to you
- Obtain a nationally recognised qualification in addition to your school certificate
- The industry specific training will help build your knowledge and understanding, to get you job ready
- Contributes to both the VCE and VCE VM senior secondary programs (is a requirement of the VCE VM)
- VET delivered to secondary school training offers some credit towards later apprenticeship and traineeship training
- Begin learning in a mature learning environment and develop independent organisational skills

- All VCE Vocational Major students it is a requirement for this group of students
- All School Based Apprenticeship & Traineeship (SBAT) students
- All VCF students can choose VFT*
 - * VCE VET students are required to catch up on classes missed on a Wednesday. However, VCE students who do VET have one less VCE subject and therefore can use these 'frees' in their timetables to catch up.


